

Caiaphas'Prophecy

High Priest in times of Jesus' crucifixion.

Appointed in 18AD with the high priesthood. He was Anna's son-in-law. NKJ John 18:13

And they led Him away to <u>Annas</u> first, <u>for he was the father-inlaw of Caiaphas</u>. who was high priest that year.

He assembled with officials and planned the arrest of Jesus. NKJ Matthew 26:3

- 3 Then the chief priests, the scribes, and the elders of the people assembled at the palace of the high priest, who was called Caiaphas,
- 4 and plotted to take Jesus by trickery and kill Him.

Then afterward, he ordered the assembling of the council to condemn Jesus. NKJ Matthew 26:57, 59

- 57 And those who had laid hold of Jesus led Him away to Caiaphas the high priest, where the scribes and the elders were assembled.
- 59 Now the chief priests, the elders, and all the council sought false testimony against Jesus to put Him to death,

Caiaphas' Prophecy NKJ John 11:49-53

- 49 And one of them, Caiaphas, being high priest that year, said to them, "You know nothing at all,
- 50 "nor do you consider that it is expedient for us that one man should die for the people, and not that the whole nation should perish."
- 51 Now this he did not say on his own authority; but being high priest that year <u>he</u> <u>prophesied that Jesus would die for the nation,</u>
- 52 and not for that nation only, <u>but also that He would gather together in one the</u> children of God who were scattered abroad.
- 53 Then, from that day on, they plotted to put Him to death
