

Warning is defined as being an alarm, signal, summons, or admonition. Indeed there are times when we do need warnings and admonitions, but come on, those labels noted above who would do such vacuous things? Well, apparently enough to warrant the cautionary. Let's not become smug, when it

In the thirteenth chapter he writes, "Walk with the wise and become wise, for a companion of fools suffers harm."

Most assuredly warnings do matter in the Scriptures, for on one hand they serve to protect from sin and destruction. Whereas on the other hand the warnings have contained within them a call to repentance and a return to God. But then there are warnings that alert to coming trials as well divine judgment (see 2Peter 3:1-13)

"For the love of money is a root of all kinds of evil." (1Timothy 6:10) A

direct warning that holds true today as when it was first issued. "Flee sexual immorality..." (1Corinthians 6:18) Remember the definition of immorality as being "any sexual activity that takes place outside the boundaries of marriage as defined by Scripture specifically, a covenant union between one man and one woman" (see also Romans 1:24-32; Galatians 6:19) Consider as well another warning, "God opposes the proud but shows favor to the humble." (James 4:6) Pride is often the precursor to downfall, while humility is the antidote the Bible prescribes.

Give heed to God's warnings. They are for our benefit. (wbe)
